Become a Printer!

What Is Stamp Printing?

Stamp printing is a way to make words and pictures by:

1. Putting ink on a stamp
2. Pressing it onto paper

Each stamp leaves a mark—just like magic!

Long Ago...

Before computers and printers, people used stamps like these to:

- Print words on papers
- Mark letters and packages
- Create pictures and designs


Kids even used stamp kits—like this one—to:

- Practice spelling
 - Build sentences
 - Make their own stories
-

How Does It Work?

It's simple!

- The stamp has a **raised design** (a word or picture)
- Ink sticks to the raised part
- When you press it on paper, it leaves a print

 That's called an **impression**

Try It Yourself!

Follow these steps:

1. Pick a stamp
 2. Press it on the ink pad
 3. Press it onto your paper
 4. Lift it up and see your print!
